

## Greetings in the Name of the Lord!

We have officially begun our stewardship campaign. The theme this year is Time, Talent and Treasure for Transition. Over the next few weeks you will get a sense of how your time, your talent and your treasure will help Rockville Presbyterian Church make its way through the double transition of a new pastor, and the transition to what the world will look like after this Pandemic. A lot of people talk about the new normal that we find ourselves in, this new normal is a period of transition, we don't know for sure how long the pandemic will last, and we won't have to social distance and mask up forever. But this pandemic is long enough that things will certainly be different when it is

over. Things won't necessarily return to the way things were, some things will of course change, but other things won't, and from our current perspective, it will be hard to know exactly what will change and what will not.

As we eventually transition out of this period of social isolation, gearing up for the new new normal will take time-- time to listen to what others are experiencing as we move towards a shifted reality, and what people are looking for and spiritual hungry for. It will also take volunteer time to take part in church wide discussions, to be an active part of the decision making process, and then once we have a clear

vision, time in helping make that vision a reality. It will take talent-- each of your talents are God given gifts. You have all been called to Rockville to combine those talents with the rest of our faith community to live into God's call of this particular church. Identifying what you can do, and letting others know what those talents are, will help us live into the fullness God intends for Rockville, if we hold back those talents, it is like putting a lamp under a bushel, we are limiting what it is Rockville can be. It is up to us to trust that God has combined all of our talents to do something as Christ's hands and feet, serving the world in Love. And it will take our treasures-- it takes money to keep our building standing, staff in our offices and to effectively and efficiently provide outreach and service. This last "T" is often the hardest to talk about, but it is necessary, and the more treasure we can gather, the more we can do, the more we can prepare and then live into the new new normal that will be coming. Imagine the joy of getting to gather together again in person, and what that new found energy and

passion might lead us towards! That is what we are giving to now, although we might be worn out, lonely, exhausted, just plain sick and tired of this pandemic, there will be another side, and it is how this particular church navigates that transition that will define it for at least a generation, possibly even two or three.

So, engage your time, your talent, and your treasure so Rockville Presbyterian Church can make all the transitions in front of it. And maybe most importantly, we need to make sure to pray, so we can make sure there is space for God's vision, to allow ourselves to be led by the spirit, to allow Christ to truly be the head of the church. There is so much in front of us, so many exciting things that might be, and it is what we do now that can make all the difference. **Greetings from the RPC Session members:** Anne Baur, Sue McGee Anderson, Bernice Brown, Mark Chittum, Marty Heilman, Elke Herzfeld, Mary Williams, Jerry Macomber and Aimee Ranaivoarijaona

The Session met with Pastor Mike via Zoom on October 13<sup>th</sup> for our monthly Session Meeting. Each time we meet, we are deepening our friendship and as Pastor Mike explains his hopes and desires for how he wants the Session to work as an extension of Christ's love. We studied parts of the Book of Order and have the expectation of sharing a book together with Pastor Mike's guidance in in order to understand more fully the task of providing effective leadership to the congregation now and in the future.

The Session has accepted the Covid-19 Task Force's recommendation for the use of the church building by members of the RPC and EPIC congregations. The goal of keeping the building safe during the pandemic is foremost in our minds. The guidance below has been adopted and will be required for the use of out building for worship services and meetings in the future:

Procedures for RPC/EPIC members' use of the RPC Sanctuary, John Calvin Room & meeting rooms in the main worship building:

"Every person entering the main building must sign in and give the following information on the sign-in sheet:

- 1. Date/time
- 2. Name
- **3**. Temperature (which should be less than 100.4 degree Fahrenheit.)
- **4.** Wear a mask at all time when in the church building.
- 5. Visitor name
- **6**. Location in the church where the individual intends to go
- **7**. Wash your hands with sanitizing solution when you are finished with the sign-in sheet.

Every member-related group must contact our Office Manager, Barbara, to add their meeting to the RPC calendar.

According to the current (10/10/2020)

Montgomery County guidance, a maximum of 29
people can attend a service in the Sanctuary and 28
people can attend a meeting in the Calvin Room.

All attendees must practice social distancing while
in the Sanctuary or the Calvin Room. After the use
of the church for Sunday worship with 29
members' attendance, the sanctuary will be
cleaned professionally on the following
Monday/Tuesday.

Each group (worshipping in the Sanctuary or meeting in the Calvin Room) is responsible for cleaning the meeting area when the meeting is over. Cleaning includes the following:

- Use disposable gloves to clean and disinfect the room
- 2. Clean and disinfect surfaces. (Ask Bob Taylor for the proper disinfectant to use.)
- **3**. Clean frequently touched surfaces such as tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, etc.
- 4. The only rest room available for use during meetings is located by the door to the parking lot. It must be cleaned when the meeting is over."

Please note at this time, the decision to use the sanctuary for regular worship has not been made. Our streaming of the Sunday worship will continue with a **9:00** am service outside of the church on Sunday morning, weather permitting.

## Rainbow Place opens Monday, November 9th



Rainbow Place Shelter will open on Monday, November 9<sup>th</sup>. There are some changes due to COVID this year. First, there will only be 14 guests instead of the usual 30-some to allow for social distancing. In addition, Rainbow Place will stay open 24 hours a day for the months of November, December, and January.

Rainbow Place is looking for volunteers to prepare and deliver lunches, snacks, and

dinners for 17 people (14 women and 2-3 staff). No volunteers will be allowed in the shelter. Meals can either be home cooked or ordered from restaurants, so even if you can't cook, you can still volunteer. To volunteer, fill out the Volunteer Form at
