

I don't think it's a coincidence that so many different faith traditions have either holidays or seasons of light this time of year (Advent, Hanukkah, Diwali to name a few). As the days

get shorter, and night comes sooner, there is a new rhythm to get used to, it can be tough and that little bit of light has a way of shining some hope into the midst of it all. This year, with the reality of continued social distancing and quarantines, that little bit of hope, those candles in the darkness, can be extra important.

Advent does center around the advent candles, but ultimately it is about preparing, preparing for the coming of God's Love into the world (manifest as Christ) which can often seem a long way off. Not being able to come together

and celebrate as a community offers its own challenges, but as we enter the Advent season we can prepare for the wait ahead, the wait for the vaccine, the wait to be with friends again, the wait to be social, to just be in community without the worry and anxiety. Advent helps us rest in that wait, to use the wait as an opportunity for spiritual development, to use it even as prayer.

So as we embark on this particularly meaningful advent season, allow it to be an intentional time of preparing amidst the waiting. I'll be discussing some practical ways to do this during my sermons during this season, but if you have questions, don't hesitate to reach out and we can discuss some specific spiritual practices that can help one get through the next few months, and to deepen one's relationship with God in the process. We can think of Advent as an opportunity, a continuation of the Good News readily offered in God's boundless love.


Thank you for supporting the raffle: The Rainbow Place raffle raised over \$16,500. Thanks to everyone who participated!
