Greetings in the Name of the Lord!

Fall is upon us, a season of transitions.

Transitions bring with them their own kind of stress, often centering on the unknowns of what will eventually come. This year, the transitions this nation and really this world face are myriad. If you ask me, some of the transitions 2020 will bring are generational and not just the standard annual variety as the pandemic will eventually guide us toward a transformed reality, for which we can currently only guess.

The pandemic and the political polarization that exist bring with them their own stress, and as

Fall marks the first indications and pointers toward Spring, the anxiety of an unknown Winter are real. In other words, there is already a great deal of underlying and "free-floating" stress as we look toward the transitions (which bring their own stress).

It is important to pay attention to and acknowledge these heightened stress levels and to be kind to ourselves and others in the midst of all of it. I think the beauty of a fall day manifests itself as a reminder to be kind to oneself during the standard annual transitions, often subconsciously. I think this year it will be important to intentionally soak in the beauty of fall, and recognize the signals it gives, paradoxically, of the annual cycle of new life.

Rockville Presbyterian Church is in its own phase of transition as I settle into being your pastor. Like every transition, it brings its own kind of stress and challenges, much of that attached to the unknowable nature of the future. But just as during Fall one can trust in the coming Spring, if, as a congregation, we keep ourselves attuned to God's love through prayer and worship and study and fellowship, we can trust in that coming Spring, and that God will bring this congregation to the places it needs to be. All the extra stress in the air risks making this particular transition for Rockville more difficult than ones in the past, but it means, I think that we just need to be more intentional about prayer and our relationship with God, much like we may need to be more intentional about soaking in the vibrant colors of fall this year.

No matter what happens, we are in the hands of God, and if we create the space for God to work, and allow God into our lives through building trust in God, we and the congregation will go where it needs to go, Spring is inevitable.

Greetings from the RPC Session members: Anne Baur, Sue McGee Anderson, Bernice Brown, Mark Chittum, Marty Heilman, Elke Herzfeld, Mary Williams, Jerry Macomber and Aimee Ranaivoarijaona

During our September Meeting, the RPC Session approved the following motions:

- To allow Rainbow Place to open 24/7 during the months of November, December and January providing the children in A+ and the Coop Nursery School have not returned to the building.
 - This change in the Rainbow lease depends on the City of Rockville agreeing to the change.
 A Zoom community meeting will be held on October 6th at 7 pm. If you are interested in attending, contact Anne Baur @ <u>amanda615@verizon.net</u>
 - If Rockville approves this change in the lease to Rainbow opening 24/7, Rainbow's rent will increase from \$100 to \$200 for each of the three months and their utilities will increase from 26% to 60%
- To adjust payments of rent and utilities by the RPCNS in view of the COVID-19 Pandemic.
 - to defer 50% of RPCNS rent (deferment: \$892 per month) and
 - to reduce RPCNS utilities payment from 33% to 22% from September 2020 through February 2021. A repayment plan has been organized for the Spring.
- To allow the EPIC congregation to hold a confirmation ceremony on Sunday, Sept 27, 2020 at 2 pm.

The Session and Rev. Mike discussed ways for our RPC members to get to meet and know him. Some of the ideas suggested were Zoom coffee hours after our Sunday service; having Rev. Mike attend the Tuesday/Friday small group meetings; have the Deacons suggest members who need an individual meeting opportunity; start a book club reading some of Pastor Mikes' favorite authors; etc.

The Session members would welcome any suggestions made by RPC members. Our new pastor is anxious to meet everyone. Please contact Anne Baur, Clerk of Session with your ideas! (amanda615@verizon.net)




Buy a Mask to Support Rainbow Place




Cents-Ability: Remember to Collect your Coins!
