Greetings in the Name of the Lord!

Often when someone thinks of Christian spiritual practice, they might think of monks, sequestering themselves within a monastery, silently doing menial work and limiting interactions to the daily Hours (various worship services during the day), but Christian Spiritual Practice is so much more than just monastics in monasteries.

Just about anything, with the right intent, can be Christian Spiritual Practice. If the intent is to deepen one's relationship with God or to better understand God's Love, then it can be spiritual practice. Engaging in intentional Spiritual Practice is such an important part of my life and something I get really excited about. Although we still have a lot to learn about one another, I am hoping we can all practice one important Spiritual Practice in particular together, and be intentional about it for a few months. I already suggested this in a recent sermon, but I want to expand on it a tiny bit here. The Spiritual Practice is Listening, we could even call it Holy Listening.

Holy Listening is recognizing that any time one listens to the story of another, it is possible to encounter the divine. What this means is that if we truly believe that God works in all people through the Holy Spirit, then as we hear the story of another, we can pay attention for the ways God might be moving in their life, and maybe even within the larger community. If one listens to enough people, they can start to

identify the way God is either working in the world, or a space where God might be calling the person to serve and give.

I am not being as specific as I would like, so what I mean specifically in the context of Rockville PC is that being engaged in the community is important to knowing where the congregation needs to focus its energies, so it can most effectively be the hands and feet of Christ in the world, to embody God's love. So intentionally listening, and pay attention to patterns, whether common joys, common hurts, common injustices, common sorrows, common wants, just listening, and asking people to explain themselves as much as possible, as a church, we strengthen ourselves

to be able to not only hear God's call for Rockville PC, but to be ready to respond.

My hope is that you all do this already, whether it's your neighbor someone at the grocery store, a co-worker. All I am doing is framing a practice you already do as an intentional Spiritual Practice. This is church work, and we should see it as such, just like listening to all of you is a central part of my job right now.

I look forward to working with all of you, and getting to know you, and learn about what you are hearing around you in Rockville and beyond!



You can donate money that will be used to purchase supplies or you can drop off supplies at the Interfaith Works Clothing Center (751 Twinbrook Parkway Rockville, MD 20851) on Tuesday-Saturday 9 am – 4 pm or Saturday 9 am – 2pm. Needed items are Binders (2 inch, 3 ring), dividers, filler lined paper, 2 pocket folders, blue and black pens, rulers, notebooks, glue bottles/sticks, whiteboards (lap sized), sheet protectors, cardstock, packages of paper, colored pencils, pencil pouches, scissors, markers, whiteboard markers, erasers, and children's underwear. Donate Food at the Rockville Senior Center

The Rockville Senior Center is currently serving about 200 seniors per week frozen lunches, shelf staple food, and fresh fruits and vegetables. The Senior Center is in need of shelf staple food donations to continue food distribution. Suggestions for food donations include: canned chicken or tuna, pasta, spaghetti sauce, oatmeal and cereal, rice (small bags or boxes), canned fruit, individual applesauce or fruit, soups, beans, all vegetables (small sizes). Donations may be dropped off under the side awning of the Senior Center at any time of the day.



Volunteer Opportunities at Community Reach

Community Reach has continued to serve those in need during COVID. The Rockville Emergency Assistance Program is in need of volunteers who are available 4 hours each week starting in September to answer routine client questions. The Senior Reach Program is in need of volunteers to mow lawns once or every other week. The Mansfield Kaseman Clinic is in need to translators who are fluent in Spanish and English to translate at the clinic and volunteers to help serve on the Mansfield Kaseman Clinic Celebration Committee for an event scheduled this November.

The following donations are also requested by the Kaseman Clinic: C-Fold Paper Towels, Paper Towels, Hand Sanitizer, Antibacterial Hand Soap, Trash Bags, Disinfecting Wipes, Scouring Powder, Window Cleaner, Facial Tissues, Bleach, Toilet Bowl Cleaner, Dishwashing Liquid.
