

Greetings in the Name of the Lord,



The image on the cover of this month's newsletter is a painting by Henri Matisse titled "Interior". He had a very long a productive career with many phases and subjects. Many of his early works are of outdoor spaces and of people gathered, but in his later life be became ill in a way that keep him increasingly indoors. As a result, when one tracks his subjects over time, the interior of his home starts to show up more and more in his paintings. I think this is because the best artists paint what they know, what they are comfortable with, what they see day to day. So as Matisse's life shifted more and more to one that was indoors, he painted what was in his doors.

As humans, I think we adjust to things, it take a little bit of time, but we adjust to changes, we get comfortable with new things. Much like Matisse finding comfort in his surroundings, even if he didn't want to be inside, and that comfort leading to inspiration.

I also picked this painting for our newsletter because, well, many of us have spent a lot of time inside our homes the last year and a half or so. What at first was difficult has, for many, become comfortable. We have adjusted to the reality we found ourselves in, and for as excited as we may be to all get out and be with people, being inside for so long, getting back out and into public gatherings, its going to be an adjustment, a little bit of a shock to our

systems.

I think as a church we have a responsibility in all this, that we intentionally work on restoring our communities, in helping with the transition back into the a world of gatherings. We can hopefully cherish our time indoors in new ways, but we are social creatures and will want to get back around others. And getting back to feeling really comfortable around lots of people, away from our homes, may take a little while.

So over the coming weeks and months, we are going to ease ourselves back into being a community of faith beyond the walls of our homes. We are not going to go back all at once, we are going to ease back in. Soon we will start holding some outside services, intentionally a little on the small side, and get us all comfortable with "going" to church again, regaining our footing. Eventually we will get fully back inside, with a benefit of all this embracing opportunities to hold service outdoors once in a while when its nice out even after we are fully back in the sanctuary!

I guess what I am trying to say is that it is OK to feel a little anxious about getting back into the swing of full fledged Sunday mornings at Rockville Presbyterian Church, it is totally normal. But we will come back and we will adjust again to seeing each other in person and giving hugs and holding hands just being in one another's company again. And more than that, we know we can come back and be ready to embrace the new things God will be and is already bringing into our midst!

RPCNS Spring 2021 Mini-Session

offering a 7 week (34 days, closed memorial Day) program

for children Two through Five years old

from Monday 3 May through Friday 18 June

The primary focus for the RPCNS Spring Mini-Session is social emotional skills, such as assisting the children with how to enter play, how to negotiate with another child, guiding the children with age appropriate conflict resolution skills, introducing the children to strategies for managing their emotions in-the-moment, and more. We'll also provide open ended art and sensory experiences, science themed exploratory opportunities and a daily story time. Our time together will be spent largely outside on our playground, but not exclusively. We'll be inside when it's rainy or if it's oppressively hot.

In compliance with MSDE's COVID-19 protocols upon arrival each child's temperature will be taken daily along with the health screening questions answered, masks will be worn, hands will be washed at several points over the course of the morning for a full 20 seconds, and social distancing will be practiced. Also, all staff are vaccinated. Parents are to send their child each day with their own snack and water bottle, extra cloth masks, and a backpack with spare clothing just in case.
