

Changing seasons require new outlooks and letting go of parts of the past so we can live into the present and embrace the future. As we enter Spring, and the Easter Season, we are also entering a new season for our world, the postpandemic season. It's not here yet, it is off in the distance still, a dim but noticeable light. Will you be prepared for the changing season?

Through **Sunday, April 18**, we will be collecting for the One Great Hour of Sharing. One Great Hour of Sharing is a national Presbyterian collection that benefits three PC(USA) programs – Presbyterian Hunger Program, Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People, and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. These programs aim to relieve hunger, promote

development, and assist in areas of disaster. In the past, the One Great Hour of Sharing Program has:

- \$4.1 million granted by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance in the United States and 57 countries in the first half of 2020
- 94 grants impacting 20 countries given by Presbyterian Hunger Program in 2019
- 50 years of ministry for the Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People
- over 17,000 people trained nationally and internationally by One Great Hour of Sharing ministries
- 5,676 Presbyterian Disaster Assistance work team volunteers served in 2019
- 234 certified PC(USA) Earth Care congregations helped care for creation
- 51,000 trees planted around the world
- over 5,000 projects in economically poor communities in the United States and around the world have had an opportunity to develop solutions to their own challenges since Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People's inception
- \$190,000 recovered in stolen wages for hospitality workers in the U.S.
- 1,097 Presbyterian eco-palms for sustainable forestry and livelihoods.

- **New Travel-sized toiletries:** shampoo, bar soaps, deodorant, ALCOHOL FREE mouthwash and hand sanitizer, also razors and sunscreen.
- Paper products: paper towels, toilet paper, paper napkins, and plates,
- **Supplies**: Liquid laundry detergent (high-efficiency/HE), fabric softener dryer sheets, laundry cards for Tropicana laundromat loaded with \$10, dish soap, dishwashing sponges, hand soap, toothpaste and toothbrushes, locks for lockers.
- **Home goods:** bath towels, washcloths, dishcloths, new pillows, new or gently used twin and queen sheet sets, fleece blankets.
- Children's NEW underwear, school supplies, socks.
- **Women's** NEW underwear (preferably cotton briefs, all sizes), incontinence protective underwear (all sizes), socks.
- **Men's** NEW underwear, fitted crew socks, boxers or briefs, all sizes to 3X; insulated underwear in large sizes, socks.
- Cleaning supplies Lysol wipes, bleach, all-purpose sprays/solutions, Windex, trash bags (13 gallon size),
 Toilet bowl brush, toilet bowl cleaner, broom and dustpan, Microfiber Hardwood Floor Mop with Mop Pads.
- Food and Cooking Supplies: Breakfast foods (cereal, oatmeal packets, breakfast bars, coffee, sugar, creamer, tea), peanut butter, jelly, pasta, pasta sauce (please, no vodka or wine-based sauces), instant noodles (ramen), canned vegetables and fruits, cooking powders (onion powder and/or garlic powder), and cooking oils (canola and/or olive).
- Additional Household Needs: a set of chairs for a small dining table.
- Misc: Tents to provide shade for the clients in weather extremes who are unable to enter the building due to COVID-19, bagless vacuum cleaner.

Interfaith Works Update

Each year, Interfaith Works serves over 16,000 Montgomery County residents. Interfaith Works operates 16 programs, has 130 staff members, and has over 10,000 volunteers. Since the beginning of the pandemic, Interfaith Works has provided \$139,000 in utility assistance, \$107,000 in rental assistance, helped 185 households prevent a utility shutoff, and 154 households avoid eviction. Interfaith Works states that between March and December 2020, the average amount of utility assistance needed per household increased by 66% to \$905, and the average amount of rental assistance needed per household nearly doubled \$953. Since its' opening, the Interfaith Works Food Hub has served 17,000 individuals and distributed 120,000 pounds of free food.
