




Skyler Sorini graduated with a Bachelor's of Science in Quantitative Sciences with an emphasis in Economics from Emory University

Community Reach Annual Gala: Thank You!

On Saturday, April 24, Community Reach held its second virtual Annual Gala. Over 100 people attended and over \$150,000 was raised. The event featured trivia and a live auction. Some of the trivia questions and answers were:

How many COIVD tests has the Kaseman Clinic provided between October and April 18? Answer: 6,030 tests

How many hours of instruction were offered in the 2020 fiscal year by the Language Outreach Program in ESOL, citizenship, conversation, and childcare/tutoring? Answer: 1,426 hours of ESOL, 120 hours of citizenship classes, 288 hours of conversation classes, and 880 hours of childcare/tutoring. This totals 2714 hours.

Community Reach Faith Advisory Meeting – April Notes

In April, the following items were discussed at the Community Reach Faith Advisory Meeting.

Highlighted a need for volunteers at the Rockville Emergency Assistance Program (REAP)

- volunteers are needed for one 4 hour shift a week. Shifts are Monday to Friday from 9am-1pm or 1pm-5pm. Volunteers are needed to answer and return phone calls. Pre-COVID, REAP was receiving 20 calls a week asking for references or assistance, while they are currently receiving about 60 calls a week.
- Mansfield Kaseman Clinic has been offering about 50 vaccines a week, mostly on Thursday and by appointment
- Mansfield Kaseman Clinic is mostly offering vaccines to clinic patients, but is open to vaccinating non-clinic patients (please call)
- If you are looking for places to donate food, check out the Montgomery Country Food Council. It has a list of places that are distributing food.


