Bible Message: Don't Worry – Remember What God Has Done

A Bewildering Week!

When we take in everything that's happened this week, worry is our natural response. But God loves each one of us. And he doesn't want us to worry. He wants us to remember who he is and what he has done.

Remembering God in the Battle

In our Bible reading this morning, King Jehoshaphat and God's people find themselves in a grave difficulty. So what does King Jehoshaphat do? He turned to God in prayer:

2 Chronicles 20:6 NLT

He prayed, "O LORD, God of our ancestors, you alone are the God who is in heaven. You are ruler of all the kingdoms of the earth. You are powerful and mighty; no one can stand against you!

The example that King Jehoshaphat shows us is to stop and pray and to remember who God is. He remembers something else too:

2 Chronicles 20:7 NLT

O our God, did you not drive out those who lived in this land when your people Israel arrived? And did you not give this land forever to the descendants of your friend Abraham?

As the King remembers who God is, he also recalls what he has done.

Don't Worry – Pray!

What is it that you're worried about? The Bible suggests that instead of worrying, we should pray:

Philippians 4:6-7 NLT

Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.

When we spend time praying, remembering who God is and what he's done, then his Holy Spirit will witness that God is greater than anything we face. He's handled our problems before and he can handle anything we face just now.
