Bible Message: Worry is Unnecessary

A worrying time

This is a worrying time for all of us. We end another week with even more restrictions on our movement. The predictions of where COVID-19 will go next are scary. It's only natural that we are worried. But when we stop to think of it, worrying is a waste of time. We know it doesn't change anything. And we know it stresses us out even more. That's why Jesus addressed it.

Worrying makes the problem grow

Matthew 6:25 NLT

"That is why I tell you not to worry about everyday life—whether you have enough food and drink, or enough clothes to wear. Isn't life more than food, and your body more than clothing?

Now he wasn't thinking about people stockpiling in a global pandemic. But his words do apply to today. Our problems with food and drink supplies won't shrink whilst we're all worrying, they'll simply grow and get worse.

We weren't created to worry

Matthew 6:26 NLT

Look at the birds. They don't plant or harvest or store food in barns, for your heavenly Father feeds them. And aren't you far more valuable to him than they are?

We weren't born to worry. We've learned to worry as we've grown up.

Don't worry - it's unnecessary

Matthew 6:27 NLT Can all your worries add a single moment to your life?

The only thing that changes when you worry is you, because it makes you miserable. It's also entirely unnecessary. Jesus concludes:

Matthew 6:30 NLT

And if God cares so wonderfully for wildflowers that are here today and thrown into the fire tomorrow, he will certainly care for you. Why do you have so little faith?

God certainly cares for you. He will surely meet all of your needs. He has put his Spirit in you to help you to trust him. He specialises in things thought impossible. There's never been anything God

cannot do. If you feel like you've reached the end of your rope this week, then God offers you hope. Give your worries to him this morning.
