Message The Big Question & Its Answer The Rev. Kent Meads

Psalm 15

It is comprised of 3 parts:

- (1) David asks a big question in v 1.
- (2) Followed by his long answer in vv.2-5a,b.
- (3) Concludes with a grand assertion in v. 5c.

The Big Question

Before we consider the long answer, we need to distinguish justification and godly living. What we find in the Bible is 2 kinds of righteousness: alien and proper righteousness.

Paul says it plainly in Ephesian 2.8-10

## The Long Answer

John Stott notes: "Indeed, no one has perfectly fulfilled this ideal except one man, Jesus Christ." (Favorite Psalms, 13)

6 couplets cover the one living in fellowship with God:

character

speech

conduct

values

integrity

and the use of money
