Formation of Joy and the Mind of Christ Two Examples of Caring for Others

Philippians 2.19-30

¹⁹I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I may be cheered by news of you. ²⁰I have no one like him who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. ²¹All of them are seeking their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. ²²But Timothy's worth you know, how like a son with a father he has served with me in the work of the gospel. ²³I hope therefore to send him as soon as I see how things go with me; ²⁴and I trust in the Lord that I will also come soon. ²⁵Still, I think it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus—my brother and co-worker and fellow soldier, your messenger and minister to my need; ²⁶for he has been longing for all of you, and has been distressed because you heard that he was ill. ²⁷He was indeed so ill that he nearly died. But God had mercy on him, and not only on him but on me also, so that I would not have one sorrow after another. ²⁸I am the more eager to send him, therefore, in order that you may rejoice at seeing him again, and that I may be less anxious. ²⁹Welcome him then in the Lord with all joy, and honor such people, ³⁰because he came close to death for the work of Christ, risking his life to make up for those services that you could not give me.

What is your love or care quotient?

Paul turns to 2 companions as examples of caring: Timothy and Epaphroditus.

The first example is Epaphroditus, vv. 25-30. Epaphroditus means «handsome, charming.» The earlier church called him «Parabolani» or «Risker.»

As one person said, "Caring is a trait of the living. Not of the dead."

He is Paul's companion in love, in work, in peril—"common sympathy, common work, and common danger." (Robertson, 93)

Paul scores Epaphroditus's care quotient—a 9.

The second example is Timothy vv. 19-24. Three **traits** show Timothy as a caring person. The first trait is: he is a «soul brother.»

Literally, it means 'of equal soul' or 'sharing the same feelings.'

Next trait, he possess a **genuine** care for other Christians.

The word "genuinely" has the sense of 'something possessed by spiritual parentage.'

Timothy saw and learned about caring for others through Paul's example of caring for people.

Do you have a model for what caring looks like?

Another trait of his care is he outstrips everyone else in his **faithfulness** to Christ.

In other words, Timothy is like His Lord who took "the very nature of a slave" (2.7) and of his mentor, Paul, who saw his work as that of a slave, too (1.1).

As Mother Teresa says, "Never be so busy as not to think of others."
