Thomas' Last Words of Faith Spoken by an Apostle

The Rev. Kent Meads

John 20. 19-31

Rollo May wrote, "The relationship between commitment and doubt is by no means an antagonistic one.

Commitment is healthiest when it is not without doubt but in spite of doubt."

When I think about "doubt" I put it between **unbelief and belief**.

Unbelief Doubt Belief.

First Paragraph: Jesus is Seen (20.19-23)

When Christ is in the Center of disciples, it led to Christ-centeredness in in the disciples' lives and ministry.

The disciples wonder, "How did He get in here? Didn't we lock the door?"

He shows them "His hands and His side." (v.20)

In other words, Jesus's body has not been abandoned or discarded.

Jesus does 2 things.

Commission them

Gives them a big gift-Holy Spirit

Second Paragraph: Thomas's Unbelief (20.24-25)

Thomas, Didymos=Twin was absent when Jesus was seen by the disciples.

They tell Thomas, "We have **seen the Lord**."

He is skeptical, obstinate and demands evidence. (v.25)

Unless he has physical evidence, he declares, "I will never believe."

At this point, Thomas in not doubting.

Thomas is standing in "unbelief."

Third Paragraph: Thomas's Confession (20.26-29)

A week has passed and once again the disciples and Thomas are in the upper room

Again, John tells us, "the doors were locked" (v.26).

Jesus says, "Hi, ye all."

Then, speaks directly to Thomas with 2 commands: "Put" and "Do not disbelieve but believe." (v27)

Thomas see that Jesus is alive and in bodily form with the marks in His hands and side.

Jesus is not a phantom.

Jesus challenges Thomas to **change**.

Thomas's confession exhibits the change: "My Lord and My God." (v.28)

The climax of passage come with Jesus's words: "Because you have seen Me, you have believed." (v.29)

"Thomas' faith is anchored in sight." (Burge)

Conclusion

Three themes that are central to the Christian faith:

1. The Resurrection

John Updike: "Seven Stanzas at Easter"

Make no mistake; if He rose at all it was as His body,
If the cell's dissolution did not reverse, and the molecules
reknit, the amino acids rekindle, the church will fall...

Let us not mock God with metaphor,
Analogy, sidestepping transcendence,

Making of the event a parable, a sign painted in the faded
credulity of earlier ages:

Let us walk through the door.

The stone is rolled back, not papier-mache,

Not a stone in a story,

But the vast rock of materiality that in the slow grinding of
time will eclipse for each of us

The wide light of day..."

2. The Holy Spirit

The Spirit is our assurance in Christ: By this we know that we
abide in Him and He in us, because He has given us of His
own Spirit" (1John 4.13).

3. The Necessity of Faith

John never uses the noun "faith" (Gk. Pistis).

The verb "to believe" (Gk. Pisteuo), John uses it almost 100
times. (Burge)
