Step 1: Get the flow from linking words and context

- **8** [And] Adds v.8 to v.7
- L1 The next morning the day after verses 1-7 ADDS
- L2 this message came to me another message after the one in verses 1-7 arrived at Ezekiel ADDS
- L3 from the LORD: the source BRINGS OUT

- L1 "Son of man, the message comes to Ezekiel, again as a descendant of Adam FILLS IN
- L2 these rebels, the people of Israel, for the same rebels as in v.2 ADDS
- L3 have asked you the rebels who ignored me, have noticed what you did ADDS

- L3 <u>These actions contain a message</u> God gives Ezekiel an explanation of what Ezekiel did in verses 1-7 **BRINGS OUT**
- L4 for King Zedekiah in Jerusalem the message has something for both the King back in Jerusalem FILLS IN
- L5 and for all the people of Israel.' as well as the rest of Israel's descendants, all 12 tribes, wherever they are FILLS IN

- L1 Explain that your actions are a sign your actions in L1 links v.11 to these actions in L3 of v.10
- L2 to show what will soon happen to them, Zeke's actions illustrate what will happen in the near future to both the King and the people BRINGS OUT
- L3 <u>for they will be driven into exile</u> the word "for" explains that Zeke's actions predict what is about to happen to the rest of the people in Jerusalem **BRINGS OUT**
- L4 as captives. Like prisoners BRINGS OUT

INSIGHTS

v.8 God didn't waste any time supplying Ezekiel with fresh instructions. Ezekiel makes sure no one thinks he made this up, himself. God, who ordered Ezekiel to act out the prophecy in verses 1-7, now provides His own divine explanation.

v.9 Ezekiel needs salvation just as much as the exiles, but he isn't a rebel. The traitors are the same people God chose for Himself through Jacob. That's how much they have betrayed Jacob and deserted God. God finally got the rebels' attention. The people who refused to notice what God showed them or listen to what He told them, noticed everything Ezekiel acted out and wanted an explanation.

v.10 Ezekiel repeats what God tells him. The people should know that this is God's personal explanation about the drama in verses 1-7. Every gesture, expression, and movement said something the LORD wanted to tell King Zedekiah, the people still left in the city, as well as those already in exile.

v.11 Ezekiel was acting out their future, because they will be forced to relocate from Jerusalem to Babylon against their will as prisoners of war by the Babylonians.

INTERPRETATION

Verse 8

[And] The LORD attaches verses 8-11 to verses 1-7

- L1 The next morning As the next day began
- L2 <u>this message came to me</u> this official, personal verbal communication from heaven arrived at me, Ezekiel its destination
- L3 from the LORD the Eternal One in heaven was its source

Verse 9

L1 "Son of man, Ezekiel, descendant of Adam, member of the fallen race who needs salvation – but not a rebel/traitor to God

- L2 <u>these rebels</u>, <u>the people of Israel</u>, these traitors who resist the government or lawful authority of God, descended from Jacob after he was converted
- L3 <u>have asked you</u> requested an explanation
- L4 what all this means. Of everything you did or acted out in verses 1-7

Verse 10

- L1 Say to them, put into words for the rebels, the destination or target of Ezekiel's words
- L2 '<u>This is what the Sovereign LORD says</u>: Here is what the Eternal One who cannot be stopped from accomplishing His will wants me to tell you
- L3 <u>These actions contain a message</u> every gesture or expression I did or acted out in verses 1-7 includes an official, personal verbal communication from heaven
- L4 <u>for King Zedekiah in Jerusalem</u> in the interest of the prince who sits on the LORD's throne on earth, the last king of Judea (who rebelled against Nebuchadnezzar, had his eyes burned out, and was carried off to Babylon)
- L5 <u>and for all the people of Israel</u>.' plus every traitor descended from Jacob after he was converted

- L1 Explain that your actions are a sign describe or make clear every gesture or expression you acted out in verses 1-7 points to
- L2 to show what will soon happen to them, what will shortly befall the traitors
