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Specialization divides us into **two** classes: experts and amateurs. No matter how much you know about a subject, the world won't let you practice it unless you are a **trained professional** at it





The need for professional training does protect us from quacks and con-artists; but we go too far when we use **specialization** to separate Bible students into experts and amateurs

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Well, in the Old Testament, **anointing** refers to **pouring oil** on people—usually kings or priests —to represent **equipping** them for their office with **the Holy Spirit** 





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"the Spirit of Truth...who will <mark>guide</mark> you into all truth," in his Gospel (16:13)





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#### Something *amazing* happens when the Spirit guides us through the Bible:



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"When the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into full truth. He won't speak on His own. He will say what He hears and...will give Me glory, because He will tell you what I say (John 16:13, 14)."



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The Spirit does not speak for Himself; He only repeats what Jesus tells Him!





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The Spirit does more than make sure you end up with *truth*; God wants you to be more than *right*. So, besides leading us into all truth—what's *right*, Jesus said the Spirit also: "convicts the world of its sin, of God's righteousness, and of the coming judgment, because it refuses to believe in Me"(John 16:8ff.)"

The Spirit wants you to **believe** in Jesus, to end up with the truth, His Son--so you can be right with Him.





Unlike **human** teachers who can only show us what's right, as the Holy Spirit leads us into what's right by repeating what Jesus tells Him, He also **connects** us by **faith** with **Christ**, to make us *right with God* 





So, **instead of** learning *about* Christ, Bible study is **actually** learning *from* Christ—through the ministry of the Holy Spirit! That's why:

That's why: Jesus told His disciples to, "Take my yoke upon you and *learn from Me* (Matt. 11:29)" And Paul urged the Ephesians to stop living like they used to, because: "this is not the way you have learned Christ--If in fact, you have heard him, and have been taught by him, as the truth is in Jesus (Eph. 4:20, 21)"





**Even** when someone shares a brilliant insight with us from the Written Word—we should explore it for ourselves with the Living Word, through the ministry of the Holy Spirit, to make sure we have been led into **full truth**, just like the legendary Bereans of Acts 17:11 who checked what Paul told them against the scriptures, for themselves





**But,** as you study for yourself, try to avoid an **Elijah** complex. Remember what Solomon said:



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So, the **safest** way to study the Bible is to check your discoveries with **many others**; we all need **confirmation** from **other** students of **God's** Word that we have heard **His** voice and understand a text as **He** intended





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because studying what others have found in the Bible instead of discovering truth for ourselves damages our personal thinking skills and destroys our ability to grasp the deep meaning of Scripture





Sacred history clearly shows that God wants us to get truth straight from **Him** instead of through others--even if truths that they **bring** to us, are **100%**

They became so frightened that they made a bad deal with Moses, saying: "You speak to **us**, and **we** will listen. But don't let **God** speak **directly** to **us**, or **we** will die! (Exod. 20:18-19). Sooo...

But you're probably wondering:



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But you're probably wondering: **How** can **Christ**, Who sits on a throne beside His Father in heaven and is no longer **physically with** us in this world, still be our Teacher? Your question deserves an answer...





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#### Let me explain:

- In Jesus' day teachers called rabbis conducted classes in the tradition of the schools of the prophets —at the center of study groups, surrounded by circles of students.
- Everyone adopted the rabbi-disciple model at the time—even Jesus, a longtime opponent of the rabbis!
- The School of Christ is actually, a rabbinicdiscipleship class!





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To guarantee justice in the often misunderstood matter of church discipline, Jesus actually said: "When two or three gather in my name, there I am in the midst of them" (Matt. 18:20)





Not only is Jesus present when His true followers come together, but they always gather around Him as their rabbi, at the center of the group, guiding, instructing, and directing them!



Not only is Jesus You see, rabbis present when His true are always in charge followers come together, of their classes—never but they always gather their disciples. Instead of around Him as their challenging, questioning, rabbi, at the **center** or **debating** their rabbis, of the group, guiding, disciples always repeat instructing, and word for word, what directing their rabbis tell them! them

It may **look** as though His followers act as judges during church discipline, but Jesus never lets go of His role as the **Leader**; He is always in charge, and He is the **only** one who ever judges His people







But please don't get the wrong idea

Jesus adopted only the rabbinic format—not the rabbinic system

Every Jewish disciple dreamed of becoming a **Rabbi**. The whole **purpose** of **discipleship** was to **end up** a duplicate of the rabbi and become a Master-Teacher yourself. **Disciples** couldn't wait to graduate and start schools of their own





#### Why did Jesus **deny His disciples** every Jewish boy's **dream** and **reserve** the titles, "**Rabbi**," "**Master**," and "**Teacher**" for Himself?



Why did Jesus deny His disciples every Jewish boy's dream and reserve the titles, "Rabbi," "Master," and "Teacher" for Himself? Because He didn't want **anyone** to get the wrong idea about Him or **His disciples**!





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Israelites put **rabbis** on a **pedestal**. They **looked up** to them as **heroes** who had their spiritual act together, perfect specimens of what **God** wanted them to be In their eyes, **rabbis** thought, spoke, and did everything right. So, Jewish disciples idolized their rabbis and studied them rather than **God**, hoping to become **duplicates** of them





They called their teachers, "Master" and soaked up all they could from them.



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But unlike **Jewish** disciples, Christians **never** master Rabbi Jesus to **graduate** from the School of Christ in **this** lifetime.

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Jews believed that studying **someone** who **mastered** his master was as good as studying with his **master**—but Christ rejected the idea **No** one—not even a **gifted** Christian **leader**, scholar, educator, or speaker will ever get to the place in the Christian life that they can say: "You don't need to study my Master, Jesus to **become like Him** Studying **me** or **with me**, is just as good as studying **Him** or **with Him!**"

#### And Jesus used the YOKE The most popular symbol of his day for the rabbi-disciple connection to prove His point





#### The YOKE represents a relationship between **two** parties



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Farmers used the Yoke to pair-up an obedient ox with an inexperienced or defiant one, so the oxen could walk together, allowing the obedient one to train the inexperienced or defiant one to become just like it





#### So, when Jesus **invites** us to: "Take my yoke upon you and learn from Me" (Matthew 11:29)



#### So, when Jesus **invites** us to: "Take my yoke upon you and learn from *Me*" (Matthew 11:29) He offers us a **personal** relationship with Him as Rabbi/Teacher and us as His disciples—so we can walk together with Him and He can make us just like Himself








A disciple can't **wander**, when **yoked** to the rabbi; what's more, walking side by side, close together, and facing the same way, the master and disciple synchronize their steps. "Follow a rabbi, drink in his words, and be covered with the dust of his feet," says the ancient Jewish proverb—because disciples followed so *closely*, the *dust* kicked up by their rabbi's feet *clung to* and *covered* them.









Jesus' disciples should follow Him so closely, that *nothing* or *no one* gets between them and **His dust**. It's the only way to live the Christian life, **now**, and end up just like **Him**.

Mentoring, on the other hand, is the supervised process by which gifted disciples equip, train, and coach other disciples, enabling them to be better students of Christ—in the School of Christ
