Since everything in the Bible leads into and prepares the way for what comes after it, refresh yesterday's Brew to let the previous passage get you ready for today's verses. Though you should have already explored the passage, personally with Jesus, here is the heart of what we saw, together.

<u>In Today's Passage</u>, verses 12-20, Ezekiel shows that the LORD's patience is past the point He will listen to any plea with four successive judgments – famine, wild beasts, sword, and pestilence – that justify His destruction of Jerusalem. So, please open your Bibles to Ezekiel Chapter 14, and let me pour you a hot CuppaJesus from today's brew, starting with v.12.

Pay careful attention to *every* item as you follow today's devotional in your study Bible. We have already grouped them by <u>colors</u> in "Today's Text," so you can follow the writer's flow of thought for yourself. Capture and grasp what he is trying to tell you with matching color pencils to

draw lines connecting items to others in the same color-family, and a black pencil to cross-link <u>items</u> from different color-families that still have something to do with one another. Use circles, boxes, triangles, etc. to identify topics and themes (triangles, for instance, might represent the Trinity). Also mark with asterisks, etc., the ones you need to look up later for more information or greater details.

TODAY'S TEXT

NEW LIVING TRANSLATION

- 12 Then this message came to me from the LORD:
- 13 "Son of man, suppose the people of a country were to sin against me, and I lifted my fist to crush them, cutting off their food supply and sending a famine to destroy both people and animals.
- 14 Even if Noah, Daniel, and Job were there, their righteousness would save no one but themselves, says the Sovereign LORD.
- 15 "Or suppose I were to send wild animals to invade the country, kill the people, and make the land too desolate and dangerous to pass through.
- 16 As surely as I live, says the Sovereign LORD, even if those three men were there, they wouldn't be able to save their own sons or daughters. They alone would be saved, but the land would be made desolate.
- 17 "Or suppose I were to bring war against the land, and I sent enemy armies to destroy both people and animals.
- 18 As surely as I live, says the Sovereign LORD, even if those three men were there, they wouldn't be able to save their own sons or daughters. They alone would be saved.
- 19 "Or suppose I were to pour out my fury by sending an epidemic into the land, and the disease killed people and animals alike.
- 20 <u>As surely as I live, says the Sovereign LORD, even if Noah, Daniel, and Job were there, they wouldn't be able to save their own sons or daughters. They alone would be saved by their righteousness.</u>

THE EXPANDED BIBLE

- ¹² The ·LORD spoke his word [Lword of the LORD came] to me, saying:
- ¹³ "·Human [^TSon of man; <u>2:1]</u>, if ·the people of a country [^La country/land] sin against me by not being ·loyal [faithful], I will ·use my power [^Lstretch out my hand] against them. I will cut off their supply of ·food [bread] and send ·a time of hunger [famine], destroying both people and animals.
- ¹⁴ Even if three great men like Noah, Daniel [^C either the prophet Daniel (who was still a young man at this time) or an ancient Canaanite hero known for his wisdom and justice], and Job were in that country, their ·goodness [righteousness] could save only themselves, says the Lord God.
- ¹⁵ "Or I might send wild animals into that land, leaving the land ·empty [desolate] and ·without children [bereaved]. Then no one would pass through it because of the ·animals [beasts].
- ¹⁶ As surely as I live, says the Lord God, even if ·Noah, Daniel, and Job [Lthese three men; <u>v. 14</u>] were in the land, they could not save their own sons or daughters. They could save only themselves, but that country would become ·empty [desolate].
- ¹⁷ "Or I might bring a war [Lsword] against that country [land]. I might say, 'Let a war be fought in [Lsword pass through] that land,' in this way destroying [cutting off] its people and its animals.
- ¹⁸ As surely as I live, says the Lord God, even if those three men were in the land, they could not save their sons or daughters. They could save only themselves.
- ¹⁹ "Or I might cause a ·disease [plague; pestilence] to spread in that country. I might pour out my ·anger [¹-rage/wrath with blood] against it, destroying and killing people and animals.
- ²⁰ As surely as I live, says the Lord God, even if Noah, Daniel [v. 14], and Job were in the land, they could not save their son or daughter. They could save only themselves because they did what was right [by their righteousness].

THE NET BIBLE

- ¹² The word of the LORD came to me:
- ¹³ "Son of man, suppose a country sins against me by being unfaithful, and I stretch out my hand against it, cut off its bread supply,⁹ cause famine to come on it, and kill both people and animals.
- ¹⁴ Even if these three men, Noah, Daniel, ¹⁰ and Job, were in it, they would save only their own lives by their righteousness, declares the sovereign LORD.
- ¹⁵ "Suppose I were to send wild animals through the land and kill its children, leaving it desolate, without travelers due to the wild animals.
- ¹⁶ Even if these three men were in it, as surely as I live, declares the sovereign LORD, they could not save their own sons or daughters; they would save only their own lives, and the land would become desolate.
- ¹⁷ "Or suppose I were to bring a sword against that land and say, 'Let a sword pass through the land,' and I were to kill both people and animals.
- ¹⁸ Even if these three men were in it, as surely as I live, declares the sovereign LORD, they could not save their own sons or daughters—they would save only their own lives.
- ¹⁹ "Or suppose I were to send a plague into that land, and pour out my rage on it with bloodshed, killing both people and animals.
- ²⁰ Even if Noah, Daniel, and Job were in it, as surely as I live, declares the sovereign LORD, they could not save their own son or daughter; they would save only their own lives by their righteousness.
