

# The Grind

Savor the taste of our previous brew



Since everything in the Bible leads into and prepares the way for what comes after it, refresh yesterday's Brew to let the previous passage get you ready for today's verses. Though you should have already explored the passage, personally with Jesus, here is the heart of what we saw, together.

<u>In the previous passage</u>, verses 42-45, the LORD sums up how He will pay back His wife for her unfaithfulness and explains her tendency toward evil.

42 Then

at last

my fury against you

will be spent,

and

my jealous anger

will subside.

I will be calm

and

will not be angry with you anymore.

43 But

first,

because you have not remembered your youth

but

have angered me

by doing all these evil things,

I will fully repay you

for all of your sins,

says the Sovereign LORD.

For

you have added lewd acts to all your detestable sins.

Everyone who makes up proverbs

will say of you, '<u>Like</u> mother, like daughter.'

<sup>45</sup> For

your mother loathed her husband

and her children, and so do you.

And

you are exactly like your sisters,

for

they despised their husbands

After that

finally

My, the Eternal Unstoppable One's hostility aimed at I/J/R/E

will be exhausted

plus

My hostile attitude provoked by I/J/R/E's unfaithfulness

will peter out.

I, the Eternal Unstoppable One will return to peace

and, as a result

will stop feeling hostile toward you, I/J/R/E ever again.

Despite that

before anything else

on account of your refusal to keep loving me the way you used to

and instead

made Me full of hostile feelings,

carrying out the whole batch of sins I mentioned in verses 35, 36, I, the Eternal Unstoppable One will give you, I/J/R/E what you deserve what you have earned with your whole batch of nauseating violations of

our (divine) marriage agreement, to quote the Eternal Unstoppable One.

Because

your crude, offensive sexual acts have intensified

your other nauseating behaviors and make me want to throw up more

than ever (shades of Laodicea).

Whoever composes short sayings of general truth or advice

will use the following words to describe you, I/J/R/E

'You are the spitting image of your pagan mother.'

Because

your female ancestor despised her male marriage partner

as well as her offspring

And it turns out, you, I/J/R/E imitate her.

What's more

you, I/J/R/E are a carbon copy of your female siblings

because

your sisters disrespected their male marriage partners, too

and their children.

Truly
your mother was a Hittite
and
your father an Amorite.

as well as their offspring.
Without doubt
your female ancestor came from Canaan
while
your male ancestor came from Babylonian stock





# **The Brew**

Let us pour you a fresh cup, ground verse-by-verse from today's passage

<u>In today's passage</u>, verses 46-52, compares Israel's abominations with those of her sister cities, Samaria and Sodom because she is already bearing the disgrace. So please open your Bibles to Ezekiel Chapter 16, and let me pour you a hot CuppaJesus from today's brew, starting with v. 46.

Pay careful attention to every item as you follow today's devotional in your study Bible. We have already grouped them by <u>colors</u> under Today's Text, so you can follow the writer's flow of thought for yourself. Capture what he is trying to tell you. Use matching color pencils to draw lines connecting items to others in the same color family. A black pen can cross-link things from different color-families that still have something to do with one another. Utilize circles, boxes, triangles, etc. to identify topics and themes (triangles, for instance, might represent the Trinity). Also, mark the ones you need to look up later for more information or details with asterisks, etc.

#### **TODAY'S TEXT**

#### **NEW LIVING TRANSLATION**

- <sup>46</sup> "Your older sister was Samaria, who lived with her daughters in the north. Your younger sister was Sodom, who lived with her daughters in the south.
- <sup>47</sup> But you have not merely sinned as they did. You quickly surpassed them in corruption.
- <sup>48</sup> As surely as I live, says the Sovereign LORD, Sodom and her daughters were never as wicked as you and your daughters.
- <sup>49</sup> Sodom's sins were pride, gluttony, and laziness, while the poor and needy suffered outside her door.
- <sup>50</sup> She was proud and committed detestable sins, so I wiped her out, as you have seen.<sup>a</sup>
- <sup>51</sup> "Even Samaria did not commit half your sins. You have done far more detestable things than your sisters ever did. They seem righteous compared to you.
- <sup>52</sup> Shame on you! Your sins are so terrible that you make your sisters seem righteous, even virtuous.

#### THE EXPANDED BIBLE

- <sup>46</sup> Your older sister is Samaria, who lived north of you with her daughters; your younger sister is Sodom, who lived south of you with her daughters [Gen. 19; <sup>C</sup>Sodom is a symbol of evil in Scripture; Deut. 29:23; 32:32; Is. 1:9–10; 3:9; Jer. 23:14; Lam. 4:6; Matt. 10:15; 11:23–24; Jude 7].
- <sup>47</sup> You not only ·followed [walked in] their ways and did the ·hateful [detestable; abominable] things they did, but you were ·soon worse [more corrupt/depraved] than they were in all your ways.
- <sup>48</sup> As surely as I live, says the Lord God, your sister Sodom and her daughters never did what you and your daughters have done.
- <sup>49</sup> "This was the ·sin [iniquity; guilt] of your sister Sodom: She and her daughters were proud and had plenty of food and lived in ·great comfort [secure ease], but she did not ·help [Latrengthen the hand of] the poor and needy.
- <sup>50</sup> So Sodom and her daughters were ·proud [haughty] and did ·things I hate [detestable/abominable things] in front of me. So I ·got rid of [removed] them when I saw what they did.
- <sup>51</sup> Also, Samaria [<sup>C</sup> the northern kingdom] did not do half the sins you do; you have done more ·hateful [detestable; abominable] things than they did. So you make your sisters ·look good [appear righteous] because of all the ·hateful [detestable; abominable] things you have done.
- <sup>52</sup> You will ·suffer [bear your] disgrace, because you have ·provided an excuse [Linterceded with your sins] for your sisters. They ·are better [appear more righteous] than you are. Your sins were even more ·terrible [vile; abominable] than theirs. Feel ashamed and suffer disgrace, because you made your sisters ·look good [appear righteous].

### **THE SCRIPTURES 1998/2009**

- <sup>46</sup> And your elder sister is Shomeron, she and her daughters, who is dwelling to the north of you. And your younger sister, who is dwelling to the south of you, is Sedom and her daughters.
- <sup>47</sup> And have you not walked in their ways and did according to their abominations? But in all your ways you soon became more corrupt than they.
- <sup>48</sup> As I live," declares the Master יהוה, "neither your sister Sedom nor her daughters have done as you and your daughters have done."
- <sup>49</sup> See, this was the crookedness of your sister Sedom: She and her daughter had pride, sufficiency of bread, and unconcerned ease. And she did not help the poor and needy.
- <sup>50</sup> And they were haughty and did abomination before Me, and I took them away when I saw it.
- <sup>51</sup> And Shomeron did not commit half of your sins, but you have increased your abominations more than they, and by all the abominations which you have done you made your sisters seem righteous!
- <sup>52</sup> You also, who pleaded for your sisters, bear your own shame, because the sins which you committed were more abominable than theirs. They are more righteous than you. So be ashamed too, and bear your own shame, because you have made your sisters seem righteous."

## THE NET BIBLE

- <sup>46</sup> Your older sister was Samaria, who lived north<sup>32</sup> of you with her daughters, and your younger sister, who lived south<sup>33</sup> of you, was Sodom<sup>34</sup> with her daughters.
- <sup>47</sup> Have you not copied their behavior<sup>35</sup> and practiced their abominable deeds? In a short time<sup>36</sup> you became even more depraved in all your conduct than they were!
- <sup>48</sup> As surely as I live, declares the sovereign LORD, your sister Sodom and her daughters never behaved as wickedly as you and your daughters have behaved.
- <sup>49</sup> See here–this was the iniquity<sup>37</sup> of your sister Sodom: She and her daughters had majesty, abundance of food, and enjoyed carefree ease, but they did not help<sup>38</sup> the poor and needy.
- <sup>50</sup> They were haughty and practiced abominable deeds before me. Therefore when I saw it I removed them.
- <sup>51</sup> Samaria has not committed half the sins you have; you have done more abominable deeds than they did.<sup>39</sup> You have made your sisters appear righteous with all the abominable things you have done.
- <sup>52</sup> So now, bear your disgrace, because you have given your sisters reason to justify their behavior. <sup>40</sup> Because the sins you have committed were more abominable than those of your sisters; they have become more righteous than you. So now, be ashamed and bear the disgrace of making your sisters appear righteous.

<sup>46</sup> 1 Your older sister was Samaria, Your, I/J/R/E's female sibling who has lived, or been around longer, Samaria, the capital of the Northern Kingdom of Israel who lived with her daughters in the north.
