 - 3. A 2nd Roman captivity: The Jews tried to reestablish the Nation of Israel with plans to rebuild the Temple in 135 A.D. the Roman Army returned and killed 600,000 Jews and built a shrine to the Roman god Jupiter on the Temple Mount.
 - 4. A group of Jews attempted to rebuild the Temple in 365 A.D., an earthquake destroyed all their material and equipment the night before.

 - A. The Temple Mount. They want to rebuild their Temple.
 - 1. To bring back the presence of God.
 - 2. To bring the Messiah to Israel. (Remember they rejected Jesus Christ as their Messiah.)
 - B. The conflict today is mostly over the control of the Temple Mount and Jerusalem.
- 4. Where it's all going. Zech. 12:2-3, 9
 - A. God will give the Jews the spirit of grace. Zech. 12:10 and they will understand that Jesus Christ was and is their Messiah. Isa. 52:6, Ezk. 39:7, 22, 25, 27-29
