- 1. Acts 3:20-21 "The Restitution of All Things"
 - A. Similar to "Restoration" but more.
 - 1) To "restore" means "to return", "to give back", "reimburse" equal to that that was lost.
 - 2) Example: <u>The Year of Jubilee</u> in the Old Testament. Lev. 25:8,10,13, 23
 - 3) Land that was sold in the past 50 years was <u>restored</u> to its original owner.
 - B. But some things cannot be restored as they were. There has to be additional compensation or "restitution". **Ex. 22:1, 5-6**
- 2. An example of how God works.
 - A. Daniel: Captured as a young teenager by the Babylonians **II Kg.20:16-18** and **Dan. 1:3-4, 6**
 - B. Daniel interprets a dream for the King of Babylon. They King's reaction: **Dan. 2:48-49**
 - C. When the Medes and the Persians conquered Babylon, their new King honored Daniel. **Dan. 6:1-3**
 - D. After Daniel was put in the Lion's Den the King said... Dan. 6:25-28
- 3. In serving God, whatever we loose will be more than compensated. **Heb. 11:24-26, 10:35-37**
- 4. When Adam and Eve sinned, they, and all mankind following, lost their, 1) innocence, 2) relationship with God, 3) Paradise, and
 4) eternal life. In Heaven all that will be returned to us who are the people of God...plus much more.
