The Word of God Made Plain II Timothy 2:15

- 1. The Doctrine of Individual Predestination.
 - A. Introduced by John Calvin in 1536. He believed that we as individuals are born to be saved or lost and that it is predetermined by God.
 - 1. Calvin's scripture reference:

Eph. 1: 4-5, 11; Rom. 8:29 I Peter 1:1-2

- 2. The Baptist movement adopted Calvin's Doctrine in part. They said, "once saved always saved." i.e., you can't be lost once you're saved.
- B. Let's look at the scriptures. I Tim. 2:1-4, II Peter 3:9, Acts 17:26-27, 30-31, Matt. 11:28, John 3:15-18
 - 1. Anyone who is saved can also be lost if they are careless in their Christian life.

Rom. 1:21-22, 24, 26, 28; Rom. 2:11; I Cor. 9:27; Ezk. 3:20; Ezk. 18:24; Rev. 2:1, 4-5; Rev. 2:12, 14-16; Rev. 3:1,5

- 2. Understanding the word "Predestination" in **Eph. 1:4-5, 11** and in **Rom. 8:29**
 - A. This is speaking of The Church collectively and not individuals.
 - 1. Note the words "us" and "we" found 9 times in 12 verses in **Eph. 1.**
 - 2. Note **Rom. 8:28, 30-32, 35-39** the plural form is found 17 times
- 3. The Church is predestined to survive all things that may come against
 - it. Dan. 2:44 Matt. 16-18
 - A. We can have a "know-so" salvation. I John 3:24
