- Mt. Sinai: Ex. 19:10-11, 16-19 God gave the
 Ten Commandments audibly, then written (Chapter 20).
 Mt. Sinai represents the power of God's Word.
- 2. Mt. Zion: Heb. 12:18-19, 22, 24, 28Mt. Zion represents God's grace in the New Testament.
- 3. Mt. Mariah: (Also the Temple Mount) Gen. 22:1-3, 9, 11-12;Heb. 11:17-10; II Chron. 3:1Mt. Mariah represents obedience to God.
- Mt. Olives: Matt. 26:30, 36, 39, 42, 44
 Mt. Olives represents <u>prayer.</u>
- Mt. Herman: The Mt. of Transfiguration. Mark 9:2-4, 7-8
 Mt. Herman represents <u>eternal life that is to come</u>.
 Phil. 3:20-21; I John 3:2-3
- 6. Calvary: Luke 23:33 or Golgotha Matt. 27:33, 35
 Calvary (Golgotha) was not a mountain but represents the most significant place and time in the history of humanity.
 Jesus paid the supreme sacrifice that each of us may have eternal life.
